





MASONIC TEMPLE, TOKYO, JAPAN

The Tokyo Masonic Building stands on one of the highest hills in Tokyo as a monument to the efforts of Masons in Japan. This beautiful building, with its grounds and swimming pool, is a well-known landmark in the city of Tokyo. The properties are owned by a foundation erected jointly by Tokyo Masonic Lodge No. 2 on the roll of the Grand Lodge of Japan and the Scottish Rite Bodies of Japan. The properties are administered by a perpetuating Board of Trustees consisting of six members, three of whom are elected by Tokyo Masonic Lodge No. 2 and three by the Scottish Rite Bodies. Portions of the buildings are rented as offices and living quarters. Masonic organizations benefit to the extent of having meeting quarters rent-free. The income of the building is dedicated to charity. A ward for children, consisting of twenty five beds, is fully maintained from this income. This ward is at St. Luke's Hospital in Tokyo, which is the finest medical institution in the Far East.

The organizations which meet in the Tokyo Masonic Building are Tokyo Masonic Lodge No. 2 and Kanto Lodge No. 11 under the Grand Lodge of Japan; Sinim Lodge under the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts; the four Scottish Rite Bodies; the three York Rite Bodies; the Eastern Star; the Shrine; the DeMolay and the Rainbow Girls. The Grand Lodge of Japan also has its headquarters in this building. All organizations are the guests of Tokyo Masonic Lodge No. 2 and of the Scottish Rite Bodies. For American Forces stationed in Japan, the Tokyo Masonic Building has been their Masonic home away from home.

PURPOSE OF THE SHRINE

The purpose of the Ancient and Arabic Order Nobles of the Mystic Shrine is to teach Toleration, Charity, Benevolence and Unselfish Friendship; and to exercise our influence to assure that Justice, Truth, and Mercy are practiced throughout the world.

Over 750,000 of the best Citizens of North America, Hawaii, Japan, and the Philippines and elsewhere throughout the World are members of the Shrine.

The major charity of the Shrine is the establishment and maintenance of Shriner's Hospitals for Crippled Children. There are 17 such hospitals located in North America and Hawaii. During the last 40 years over 250,000 children, regardless of race, creed or color, have been made well, are now able to walk, run and play like other children, lead normal lives and become useful citizens.

Here in Japan, the Torii Oasis Shrine Club has for several years been selecting and placing in two hospitals, underprivileged Japanese children whose bodies or limbs have been deformed either at birth or as the result of illness.

Although the Shrine Club is a small unit, it is maintaining regularly about 15 children in two hospitals for an average of 6 months for each case. To date, as the result of the Shrine Program in Japan, over 100 children, who at one time could either not walk or only crawl or walked with difficulty, are now enjoying life.

The Shriners and Masons here in Japan are hoping to expand the crippled children's project so as to provide a better service for many more unfortunate children.

"A smile, a squeeze from a small hand and a look of deep appreciation from a child who is now walking and who had never hoped to walk, is a most gratifying inspiration to expand this program. 'No man ever stood so straight as when he stooped to help a crippled child'," is well said by Noble Earl A. Richhart, Chairman of the Hospital Committee.





Requirements for Entrance to Shriner Hospitals

The following requirements for admissions are observed without exception:

- 1. The parents must be unable to pay for the medical services.
- The primary reason for treatment must be to improve or cure a crippled or deformed condition.
- The child must be under 14 years of age, and it should be reasonably certain that treatment can be completed before the age of 14 years.
- 4. The child MUST be of sound mind, of average intelligence, and reasonably normal mental activity.
- The child must be examined and approved for admittance by the Chief Surgeon of the Hospital, or by his assistant.
- The application form must be signed and vouched for by a Shriner who personally knows the financial condition of the parents or guardian.

What Would You Do?

If a crippled child knocked at your front door and told you that for \$150.00 he could be made well again; that by your help he might take his proper place in his fun world, and romp with normal children—what would you do?
