

MESSAGE





AFIFI TEMPLE



On or about July 25, 1888, a petition for the establishment of Afifi Temple A.A.O.N.M.S., was signed and forwarded to Sam Briggs, Imperial Potentate of the United States and Canada, said petition being signed by the following Nobles: W.J. Thompson, Islam Temple: S.C. Milligan, Abdullah Temple: Franklin B. Gault, El Jebel Temple: and by Sir Knights C.N. Daniels, E.T. Durgin, Henry Drum, E.R. Hare and W.C. Rowland. Noble Franklin B. Gault being named as Grand Potentate in said petition.

On Monday, September 17, 1888 the fraternity named in said petition met at "The Tacoma Hotel" where and when Noble Frank S. Hastings of Abdullah Temple, Leavenworth, Kansas, submitted his credentials as the authorized deputy of the Imperial Potentate to establish Afifi Temple at Tacoma, Washington Territory, and delivered to Franklin B. Gault the dispensation for Washington and British Columbia, issued by the Imperial Potentate Sam Briggs, in which said Franklin B. Gault was confirmed as Grand Potentate and the other Nobles and Sir Knights named in petition were designated as Charter Members. Noble Franklin B. Gault was duly installed Grand Potentate and Sir Knights Daniel, Drum, Durgin, Hare and Rowland were obligated as Nobles of the Mystic Shrine.

The Affairs of Afifi Temple developed nicely through the "Gay Nineties". At the turn of the century the Nobles began to think in terms of Uniformed Units. At the end of twenty years the Temple became travel-minded and began to participate in Imperial Council Sessions by sending the Patrol to Louisville, Kentucky, in 1909, and the Band to New Orleans, Louisiana, in 1910. From those days on, the Temple has ever remained travel-minded. In evidence thereof, our Units participated in a joint Ceremonial with Gizeh Temple in 1913, at Victoria, B.C., crossed the continent to Atlanta,

Georgia in 1914 and back to Buffalo, New York by special train in 1915.

Immediately following the Portland Conclave, the Afifi Imperial Alaska Pilgrimage sailed from Tacoma on June 25, 1920 aboard the S.S. "Jefferson" and S.S. "Spokane", chartered for the trip, our Band being aboard the steamer "Spokane" and our Patrol quartered on the steamer "Jefferson". Additional personnel in this large party were many notable Shriners and their families from many states of the union. All members of the Imperial Divan except one were the personnel of this traveling party. The itinerary of this trip lasted fifteen days and included outstanding participation at Wrangle, Petersburg, Ketchikan, Juneau, Skagway, Haines and Sitka, all of Alaska. The appearance of a gaily bedecked Band and Patrol on the streets of these faraway towns brought forth much rejoicing and wonderment from the natives. In several instances it proved to be the first event of a brass band appearing on the street of the respective towns and in the main, we were informed it was a precedent in the history of Alaska that a band had ever come to Alaskan shores from outside territory.

In 1921 our distinguished members Edward B. King and Grover C. Nolte, both Imperial Representatives Emeritus, conducted Afifi Temple's first Pilgrimage out to the Orient, under dispensation to conduct the first Shrine Ceremonial in China and then the Empire of Japan. A Ceremonial was also held in Manila. Afifi Temple has since been to the Orient to conduct Ceremonials in Japan, China, and the Philippines in 1926, 1933, 1960, 1963, 1966, 1969, 1972, 1975, 1978, 1981 and now in 1984.

Afifi Temple, being a pioneer Temple of the great Pacific Northwest, conceived the idea in early days that there would be much merit by reason of their isolation, if the Pacific Northwest Temples would consolidate their interests in a solid front for the good of all causes that concerned these Temples of the Northwest area. This idea for a coalition originated in 1912 or thereabout, through the promotion of Ellis Lewis Garretson, Past Potentate of Afifi Temple and then Imperial Oriental Guide. Fifteen Temples subscribed to this program and within a reasonable number of years it became apparent in National Shrine Circles that this block of Temples out in the Northwest had become an important factor in the affairs of the Shrine nationally.

Afifi Temple was fortunate in having one of its Past Potentates, Chester A. Hogan, as Imperial Potentate of the Shrine of North America in 1968 and 1969, with the

Imperial Session being held in Seattle, Washington in 1969.

Due to the efforts of our officers and headed by Past Imperial Potentate Chester A. Hogan, Chairman of the Building Committee, Afifi Temple moved into its new Mosque in May of 1974. A 7,200 square foot addition has since been added to our Mosque for Temple Unit rooms and storage. It has been an important step for our Temple.

Afifi Temple can look to its history with pride and to the future with great

enthusiasm and glory to come.

SHRINERS HOSPITALS FOR CRIPPLED CHILDREN



Since 1922

The 1984 Shriners Hospital for Crippled Children budget excess of \$162 million. This includes \$52 million earmarked for construction. and equipment and \$110 million for operating expenses. It's the largest budget in the 61-year history of Shriners Hospitals.

Several of the 22 Shriners Hospitals opened in the early to mid-1920's and efforts are being made to modernize several of these facilities. Six hospitals are undergoing construction and renovation projects and five new facilities are under construction.

The following is an overview of the construction and renovation projects currently underway at several Shriners Hospitals (all completion dates are tentative and all dollar figures are estimated):

Cincinnati: The Board of Trustees is studying several site locations for a \$20 million facility to replace the existing 18-year-old facility.

Erie: An estimated \$2 million renovation and expansion project - which includes the patient care areas, outpatient clinic wing, surgical suite and recreation areas - is expected to be completed in June 1984.

The Shriner's 22nd hospital will open in Tampa, Florida by September 1984.

Greenville: An agreement to lease six acres of land for the construction of a new hospital was signed in November 1983. The new facility will be located adjacent to Greenville Hospital Center. The Building and Equipment committee is in the process of selecting an architect

Honolulu: Approximately \$500,000 has been appropriated for renovations of the patient care areas and redecoration of the entire hospital.

Intermountain: Approximately \$1.7 million has been appropriated for extensive remodeling of the out-patient clinic, medical records area, operating suites and upgrading of the mechanical and electrical systems.

Lexington: A new \$20 million facility will be built on the same site as the existing facility. When the new hospital is completed the original facility, built in 1926, will be torn down.

Los Angeles: An entire reconstruction of the existing facility, costing approximately \$32 million, is scheduled for completion by December 1984.

Montreal: An estimated \$8.5 million in renovations to all patient care and surgery areas are scheduled for completion in late 1985.

Portland: A new \$21.6 million. 40-bed, facility was completed in August 1983. The hospital has a research department that conducts basic collagen research. Collagen is the connective tissue between the bones and

San Francisco: Approximately \$600,000 in renovations are underway to accommodate the new, 8-bed, spinal cord injury unit which is scheduled to open in late spring 1984.

Shreveport: Since June 1983, the patients and staff have been housed at neighboring Doctors Hospital. The old Shrine unit, built in 1922, was torn down in late fall 1983.

A new \$16 million facility is scheduled to be completed on the same site by late 1985. The construction contract was awarded in December 1983.

Tampa: The new \$20 million, 60bed, hospital is expected to open in September 1984. This ultra-modern facility will be located adjacent to the University of South Florida College of Medicine.



The new Shreveport Unit will cost approximately \$16 million.

Mikako (Mikachan) Kawasaki

Born November 5, 1965, in Kanagawa Prefecture

Miss Mikako Kawasaki, presently age 18, came to the attention of Torii Dasis Shrine officials when she was a very young girl. As an infant, before she was two months old, she was attacked by a cat which after severely mutilating the orbital maxillary regions of right eyeball left her in a pool of blood, but alive. The subsequent sorrow pain suffered by Mikako's mother caused her to lose her sanity and the Kawasaki child was destined to be raised in the atmosphere of orphanage lifestyle.

Mikako lost more than her eye. Complications occurring after the tragic attack and necessary emergency surgical procedures left Mikako without even the eye socket. The entire area was closed in scar tissue and subsequent abnormalties could not be the subject of corrective procedures for many years due considerations of normal growth of the child and associated changes in facial characteristics. It was Mikako's fate to "live with" her condition through her childhood and young adult years.

Finally, just two years ago, at age 16, Mikako began a series of very complicated and painful surgical operations. Both her physical endurance and her emotional stability was to be put to the test. Mikako came through bravely.


Through the processes of reconstructive surgery a completely new eyesocket has



been created for Mikako and the entire area around the right eye has been resurfaced including the right cheekall with skin removed from her neck area.

Behold! Mikako now has her new artificial eye and her final major surgery efforts are complete. Only minor adjustments to improve the eyebrow and touch-up efforts around the eye area need to be done. Recently, Mikako graduated from High School, and like any other young lady desires to be successful in a career.

TOSCJ is proud to have had a part in directing, monitoring, and supporting Mikako's rehabilitation and we hope we can provide her additional guidance that might aid her in realizing her future goals and ambitions.

The Order of the Temple is the summit of Freemasonry as exemplified in the York Rite and a Knight Templar is eligible to petition for membership in the Shrine.
